### Superintendent

Dr. Spring thanked the Board, administrators, faculty and staff for a smooth opening to the school year.

#### First New York Federal Credit Union School Program

Mrs. Makensie Bullinger, High School Assistant Principal, and Mrs. Susan Braiman, Business Teacher, explained that the district had been offered the opportunity to have a branch office of First New York Federal Credit Union in the high school, which would be staffed by high school students under the advisory of Mrs. Braiman. They explained that it would not only provide a service to students and employees, but also offer real-life banking experience to students. Interested students from the College Accounting class will have the opportunity to go through an interview process, training, and earn high school credit through their employment with the credit union. Ms. Braiman introduced Ms. Christy Smith and Ms. Lucy Gottung, representatives from First New York Federal Credit Union, who spoke briefly about the history of the credit union and also mentioned the success the credit union has had with their Patriot branch at Schenectady High School. They hope to get the Mohonasen branch operational by mid-October.

#### Presentation on 9/11 Monument in HS Courtyard

Mr. Patrick McGrath stated that construction on a monument commemorating 9/11 has been ongoing for the better part of six months in the high school courtyard. He explained that Mr. Lars Turin, retired art teacher; Joe Jasenski, and Nick Tommasone, former students who graduated in June; and Devis Ceci who is currently a senior, have been working almost every day throughout the spring and summer on the 16-foot Twin Tower memorial. It will be dedicated on Tuesday morning, September 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### School Tax Presentation

Dr. Spring stated that she and Mrs. Denise Swezey had spent a great deal of time last week fielding questions from district residents regarding their taxes. She explained that due to the first reassessment of property in the Town of Rotterdam in over 50 years, some district residents are frustrated and angry with an unexpected increase in their tax bills. Dr. Spring and Mrs. Swezey showed a brief PowerPoint presentation on how school tax rates are set and explained the differences between the Mohonasen & Schalmont districts with regard to the Homestead/Non-Homestead option.

Dr. Spring and Mrs. Swezey also spoke about the EXCEL referendum scheduled for October 16<sup>th</sup>. They stated that this project, which would be used mostly to make needed repairs to infrastructure, would be at no cost to taxpayers. Several Board members commented on the fact that this may be a one-time offer and that it would be in Mohonasen's best interest to take advantage of it.

Mrs. Nancy del Prado also explained what administrators and members of the school board had been doing in regard to lobbying for school tax reform.

### **Board of Education**

Mrs. Eileen French reminded everyone of upcoming calendar events for the next two weeks. She also asked Board members to email her regarding their availability for attending Open Houses in the district.

### **Student Representatives**

Mr. Patrick McGrath introduced this year's student representatives, Skylar Aviza and Matthew Farrell. Ms. Aviza and Mr. Farrell stated that the opening of school went well. Mr. Farrell said that students enjoyed the tailgate party prior to the football game on September 7<sup>th</sup>. They stated that students were looking forward to the football game honoring military families on September 20<sup>th</sup> which will feature fireworks after the game. They spoke about Homecoming which will be on September 28<sup>th</sup>. Ms. Aviza and Mr. Farrell were also in the process of sending out a Student Interest Survey.

### **Privilege of the Floor**

Mrs. Eileen French read the guidelines for Privilege of the Floor.

Mr. Melvin Mintz of 2273 Helderberg Avenue offered an article which appeared in Time Magazine to the Board for their review. He also spoke about his concerns regarding his year's school tax bills and their effect on district residents.

Mr. Daniel Lucca of 2103 Rensselaer Avenue commented that he had been overpaying taxes for the past 30 years and was very glad to see with the reassessment that his school taxes went down.

Mr. Howard Vincent of 2253 Helderberg Avenue stated that he had petitioned the school Board to secede from the union and asked them to consider the request, as there is a November deadline. Mrs. French stated that she would speak with the Board and the Superintendent and get back to him. He also expressed frustration with his school tax increase and the fact that the impact statement sent out in March had been so far off from

the actual tax bill. Mrs. Swezey explained that there had been a discrepancy in the tax rate on the impact statement and that it had been sent out without any school district input.

Several other district residents expressed similar concerns regarding their school tax bills.
